Take a picture of the following and email them to ridgefieldscav@gmail.com

- Enjoy an ice cream from Deborah Ann's (curbside or delivery); take a picture
- Show us your handstands---- in front of the library
- Draw a picture of the Gilbert fountain on Main Street; tell us the history of this landmark
- Find 5 wildflowers around town, draw them, and identify them!
- Decorate a rock and leave it somewhere around town for others to enjoy
- Share a positive message with Ridgefield by creating a chalk drawing on your driveway
- Tie an orange ribbon around a tree or mailbox on your property
- Visit 4 "Museum of the Streets" plaques on Main Street.
- Take a family selfie in the gazebo in Ballard Park
- Bake a treat with your family and take a picture of them eating it
- Make a dinner for your parents one night---tell us what you made.
- Find the bell on the Bailey Avenue side of Town Hall; tell us the history of this landmark (1-2 sentences)

1. **Aldrich Park**- Easy to moderate. Some steep sections.
2. **Old Sib**- Easy to moderate
3. **Florida Refuge**- Moderate with some hills.
4. **Bennetts Pond** (beaver dams)- Easy in low section, steep grade in climb to Pine Mountain
5. **Great Pond Trail**- Moderate with some hills.
6. **Mountain Lakes**- Easy to moderate

While you are hiking, look for the following: (send pictures to ridgefieldscav@gmail.com)

- Find a good stick and make a walking stick--- decorating it with your own design
- Find a bird in a tree, take a pic and identify the bird
- Find a rock taller than you
- Snap a selfie with your family in front of something interesting on each trail
- Take a scenic picture of a trail
- Draw a picture of the leaves of 3 different trees you see on your hikes and identify them
